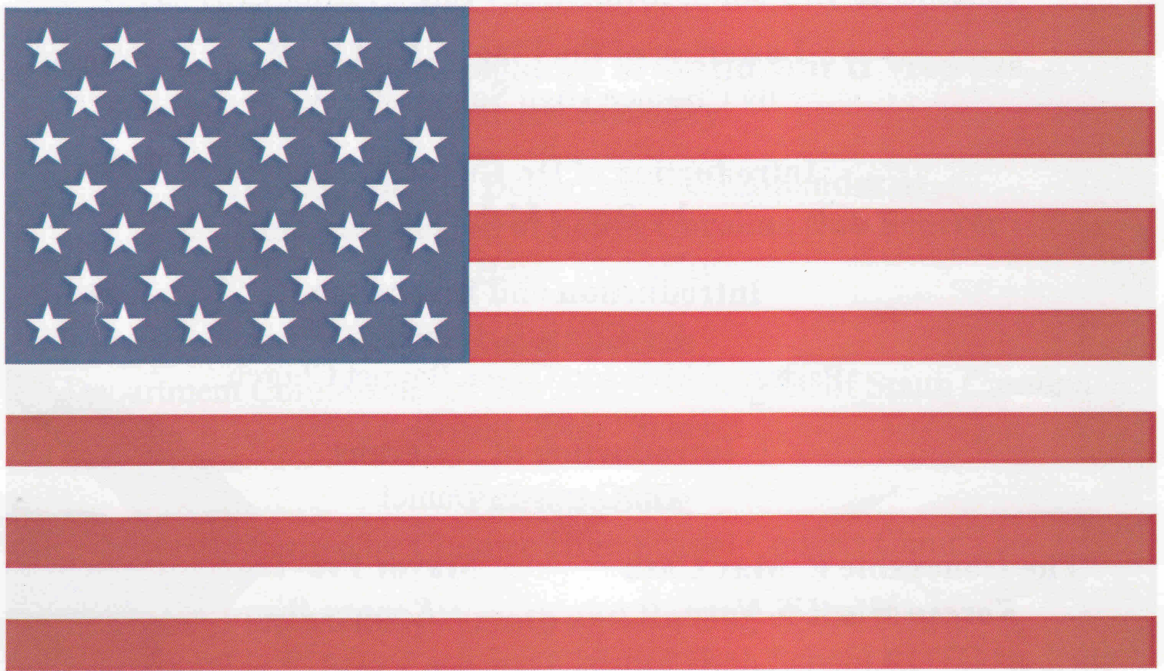

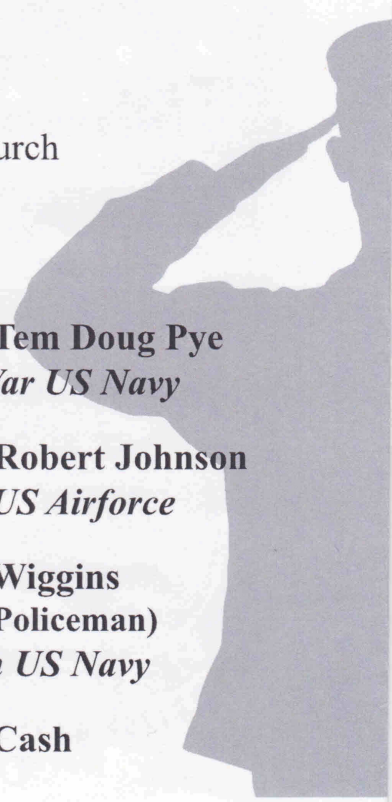

Robert "Bob" Scherer is a Veteran of the United States Air Force. He served in the Vietnam Era from 1962-1966, with two years reserve duty from 1966-1968. He was honorably discharged with the rank of Staff Sergeant.

Bob has been a continuous member of the American Legion on and off since 1966 with 22 years of continuous service as of 2016. He moved to Spartanburg, South Carolina in July of 2011 and joined Boiling Springs Post 200 in March of 2012. Bob has served through many states and held several offices from Post level, District Level to Department Level where he was elected State Commander in June 2016. Bob has been instrumental in forming three Honor Guards, in Florida, North Carolina and South Carolina.

Bob continuously supports the American Legion and their four pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation), National Security, Americanism & Children and Youth) with enthusiasm and dedication. He has served on the American Legion National Security Committee since 2014. In supporting one of the four pillars, VA & R, Bob was instrumental in establishing a Veterans program for Hospice of North and South Carolina. In the community, Bob volunteers at the Gibbs Cancer Center and also serves on the Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System Volunteer Executive Board. He was selected the "Volunteer of the Month" in October 2013. Bob has also been an active member of the Sunrise Civitan Club of Spartanburg for over a three years, which provides community service, knowledge, fellowship and support for Spartanburg County. He is currently serving on the Executive Board and Youth Service Committee as well as Chaplain.

Bob enjoys being there for the Legionnaires to help in any way he can and he will travel all over the SC State. He will always tell you "I'm here for you."
